





Old propane tanks that you find are not safe to use or touch. The gas inside this tank can cause harm to lungs and burn skin.



Drugs and chemicals get into food when it is stored nearby. People who eat this food may get a stomach ache or feel sick.



This is a meth lab.
This can burn your skin and harm lungs. Shaking it may cause a fire or explosion. Remember: the line at the bottom means DANGER.



Some people use needles to put drugs in their bodies. These needles may stick you and make you sick.



This garbage was left behind by some people who made meth. If you see trash like this, tell an adult.





Coffee filters stained with red or yellow may have chemicals on them. These chemicals can burn skin and harm lungs.



If you see this, tell an adult and ask them to help you call for help.
