


Youth make up 7% of the more than 1 million people in the U.S. living with HIV. Schools have direct contact with 50 million youth and play an essential role in helping youth make healthy choices. School programs are vital to achieving an HIV-free generation.

## Risky Health Behaviors

Of high school students in 2011:

have ever had sex

have had sex with 4+ people (during their lifetime)

are currently sexually active

and of these.

did not use a condom the last time they

(have had sex during previous 3 months)

HIV Education & Testing

had ever been

Of high school students in 2011:

84 / Co taught in school about **AIDS or HIV infection** (a decrease from the 1997 figure of 92%)
