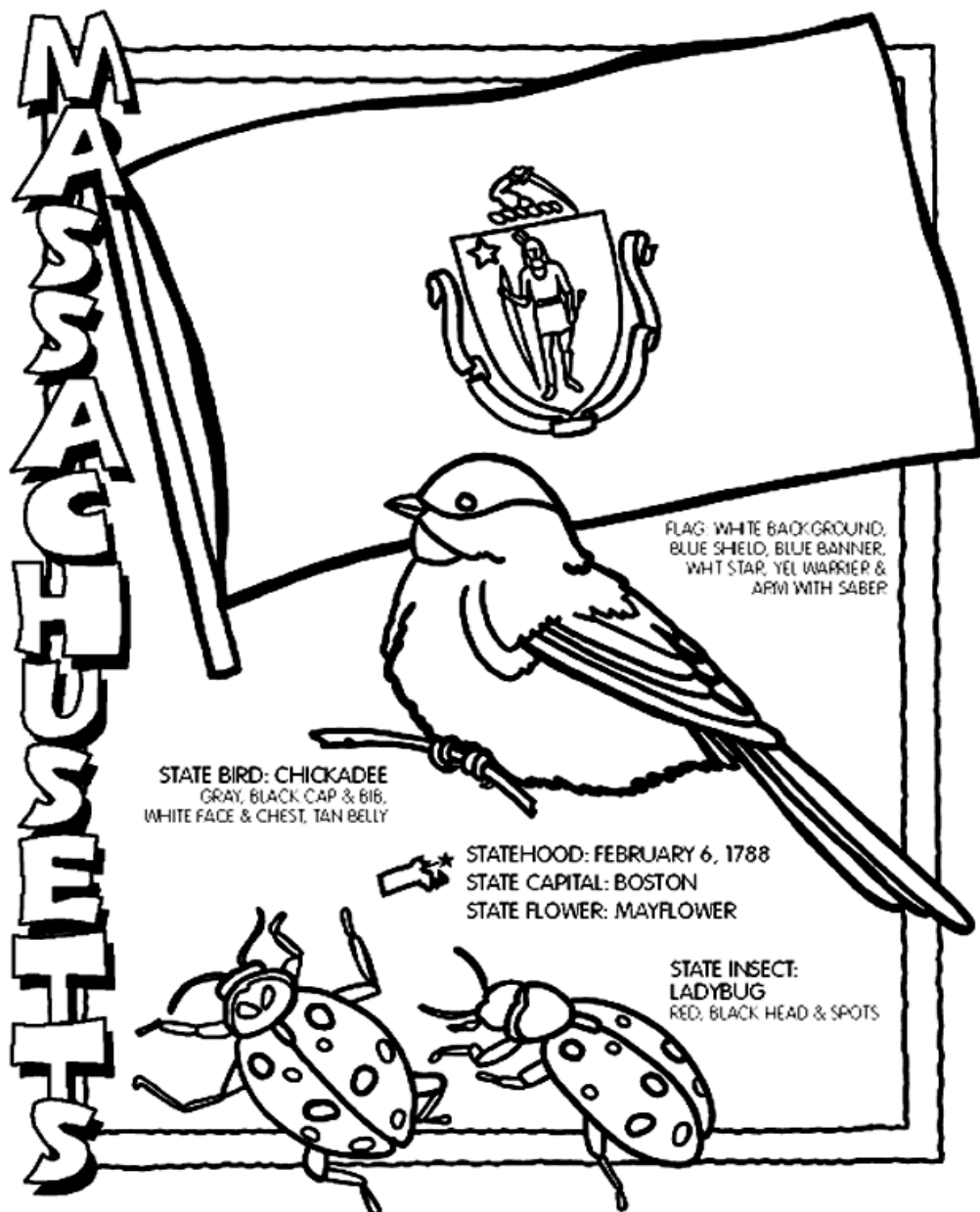

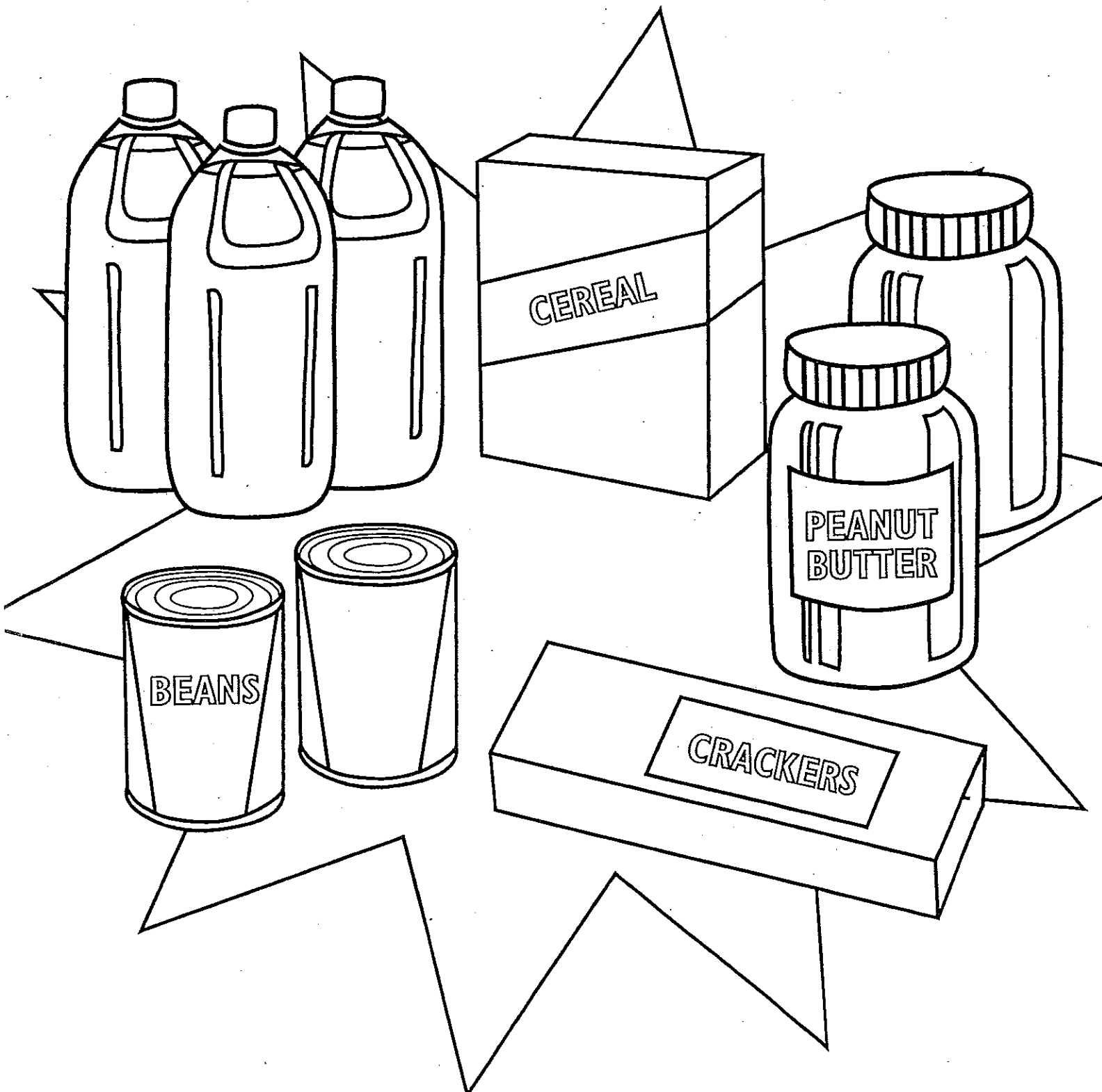

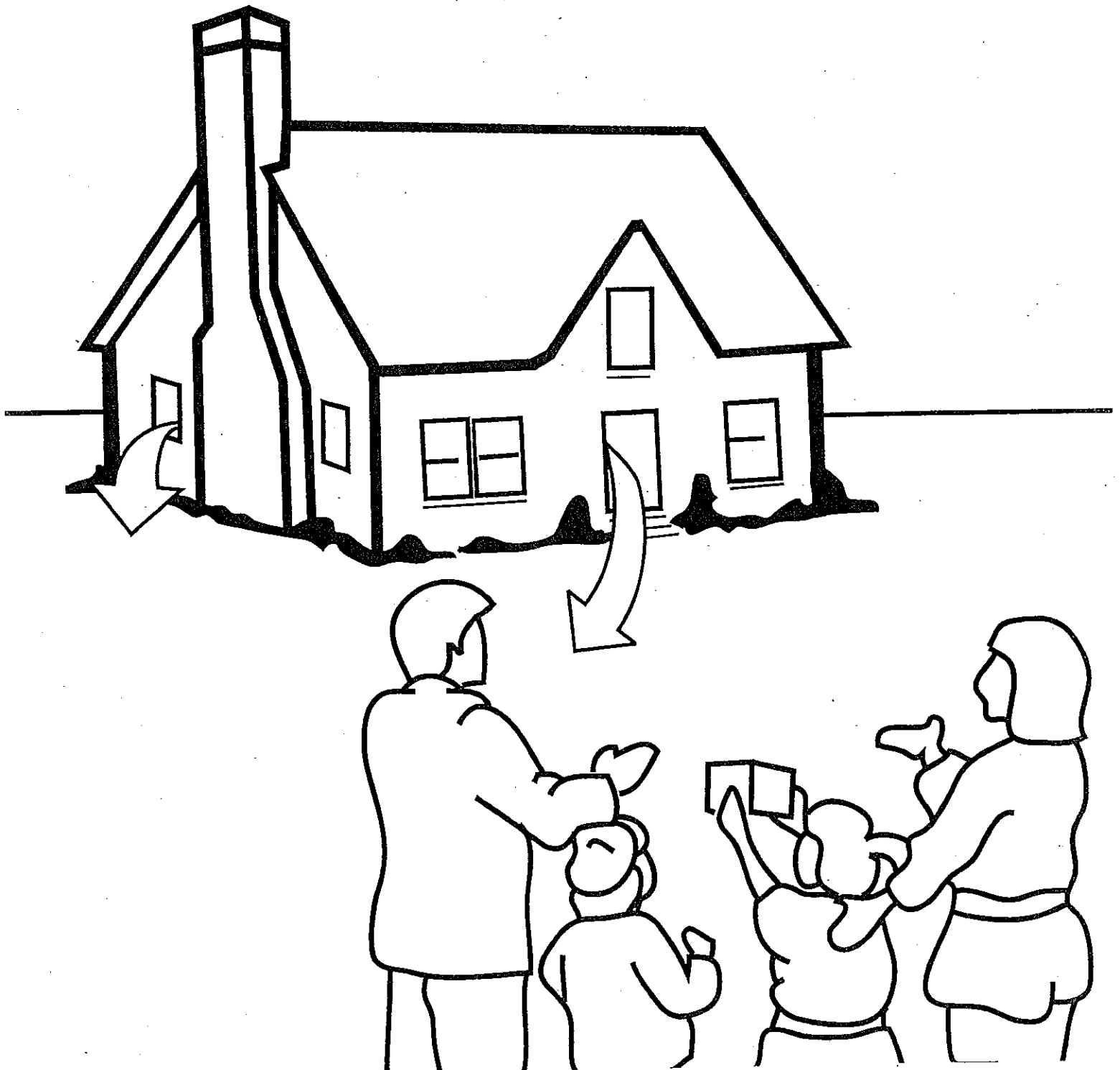
Emergency Supply Kit

Every family should have an emergency supply kit. Keep your kit in an easy to find place. The kit should include water and high energy foods that do not need to be cooked or refrigerated. Stock enough food to feed you and your family for three days.



Plan an Evacuation Plan from your Home.

Escape plans need to be planned and practiced with grown ups. Try to have two exits from each room and plan a common meeting place. Your family should have a single contact person whom you can contact in the event of an emergency.



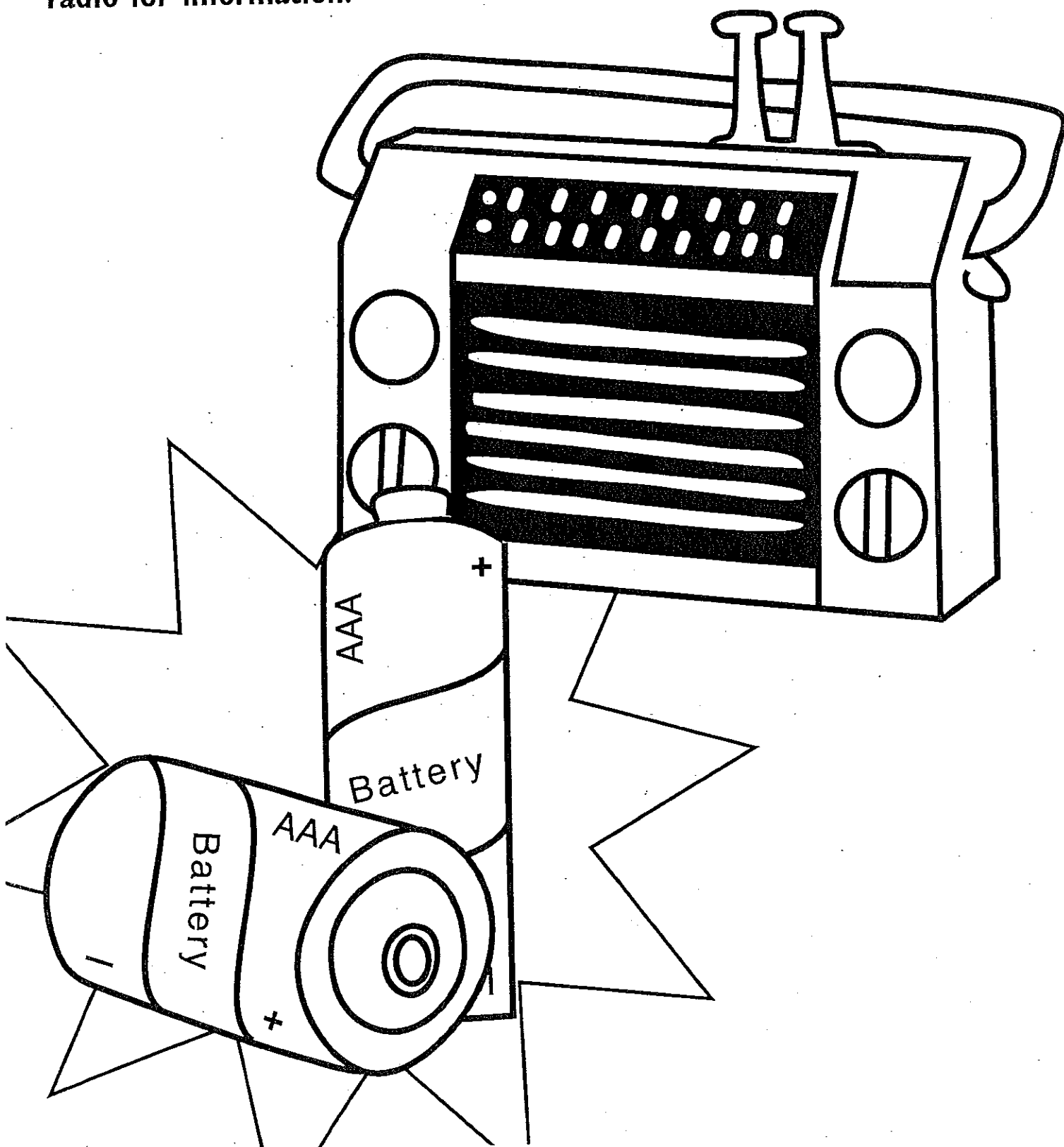
Pets are family members too!

Make sure your pet's nametag includes their name, address
and a family member's cell phone number.



Replace Batteries twice a Year

In an emergency, electrical units may not work. Make sure that radios have new batteries in them so that you will be able to listen to the radio for information.



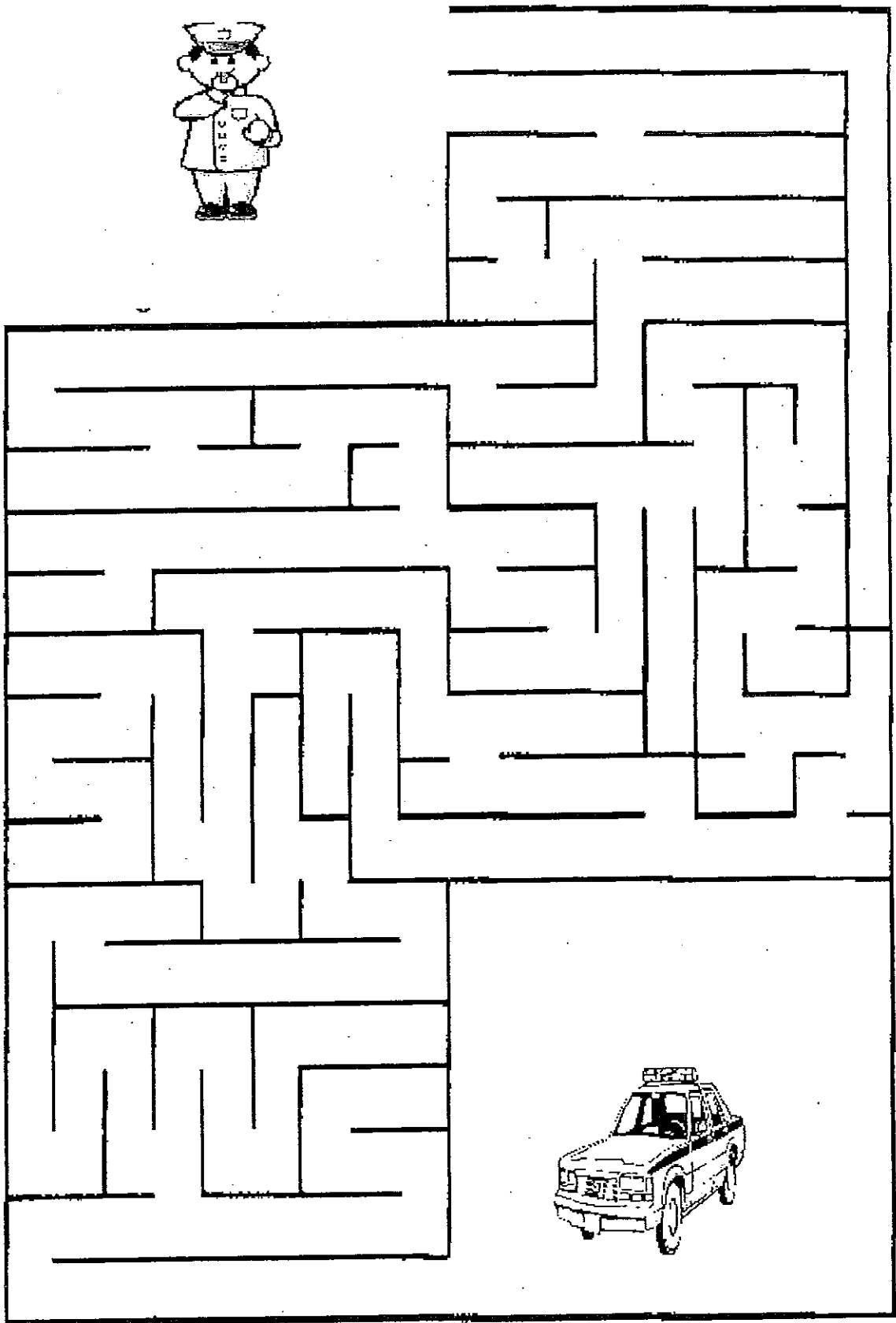
If you see flood waters, move away from them. Go to a higher place. Never play near or try to swim in flood waters.
