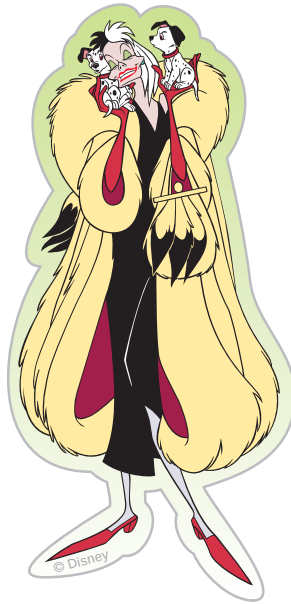
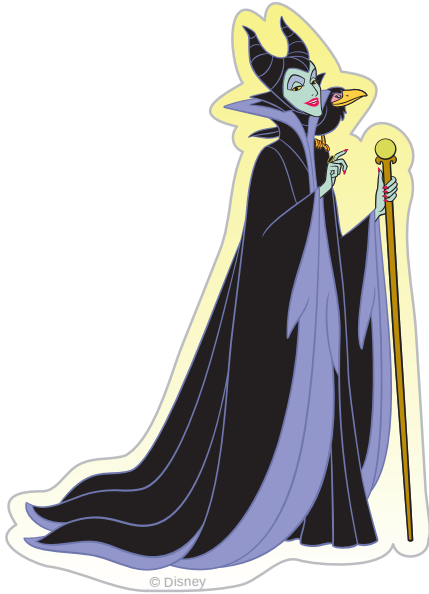


Vampire Mickey Candy Box: Instructions

1. Print the template on regular paper or cardstock and cut out the pieces. Make all folds along dashed lines.
2. Using either glue or double-sided tape, close Mickey's body by securing the A tab to the back piece.
3. Close the bottom of the candy box by securing the B tabs, followed by the C tab.
4. Fold each of Mickey's arms in half along the dashed line so the design is two-sided. Without sticking the tabs together, secure the two sides.
5. Butterfly the tabs on Mickey's arms, and use them to secure his arms to the sides of his body.
6. Finally, fold the top dashed lines on Mickey's legs toward you, and fold the lower dashed lines away from you – this will help him sit in place.

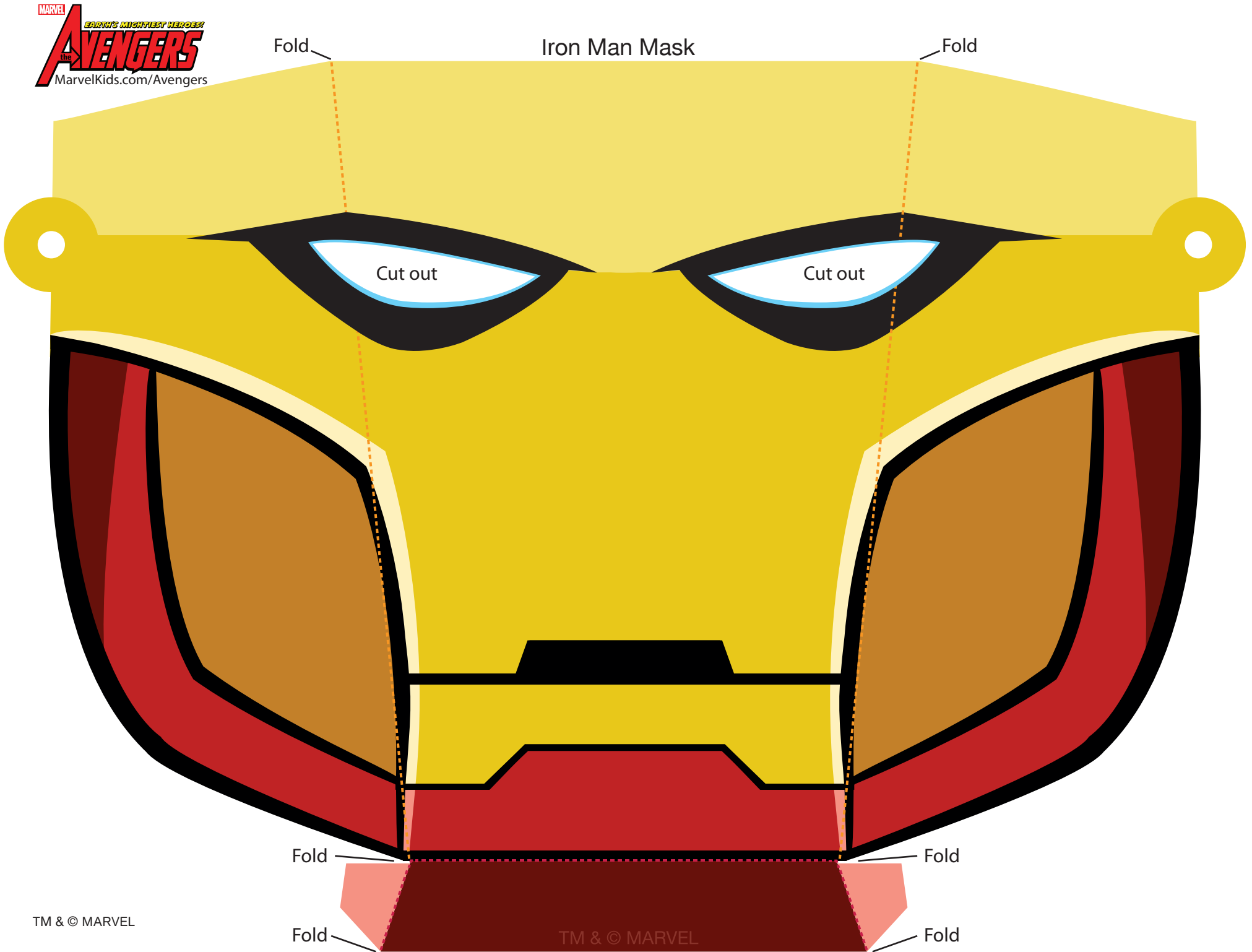

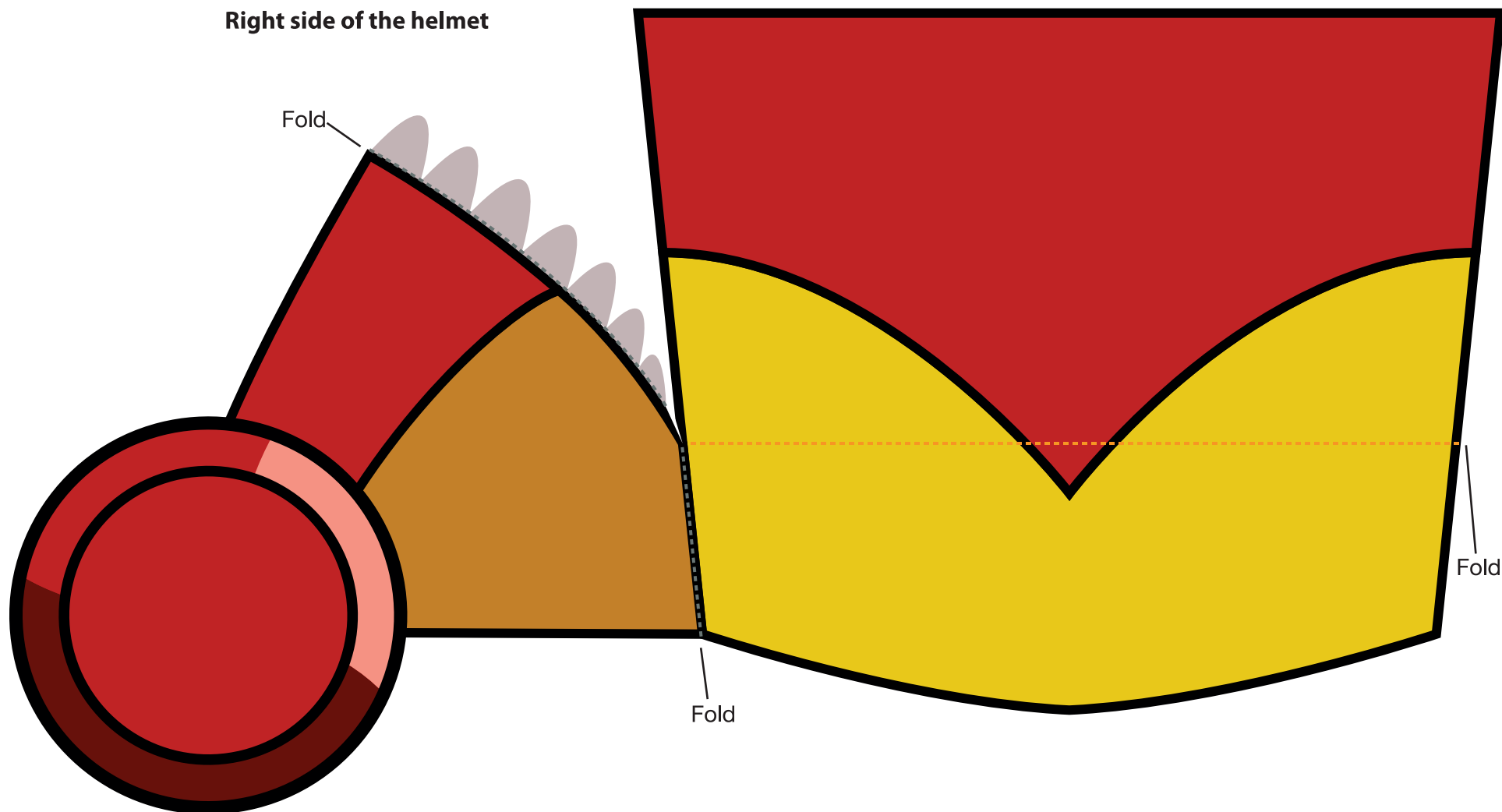

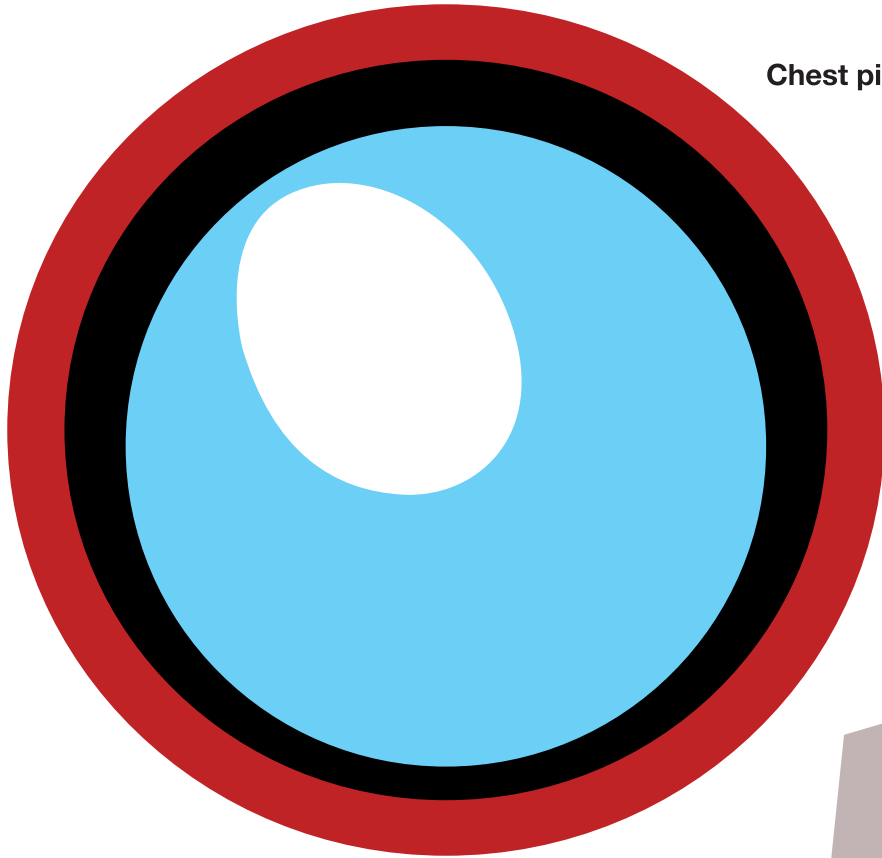
Iron Man Mask

Right side of the helmet

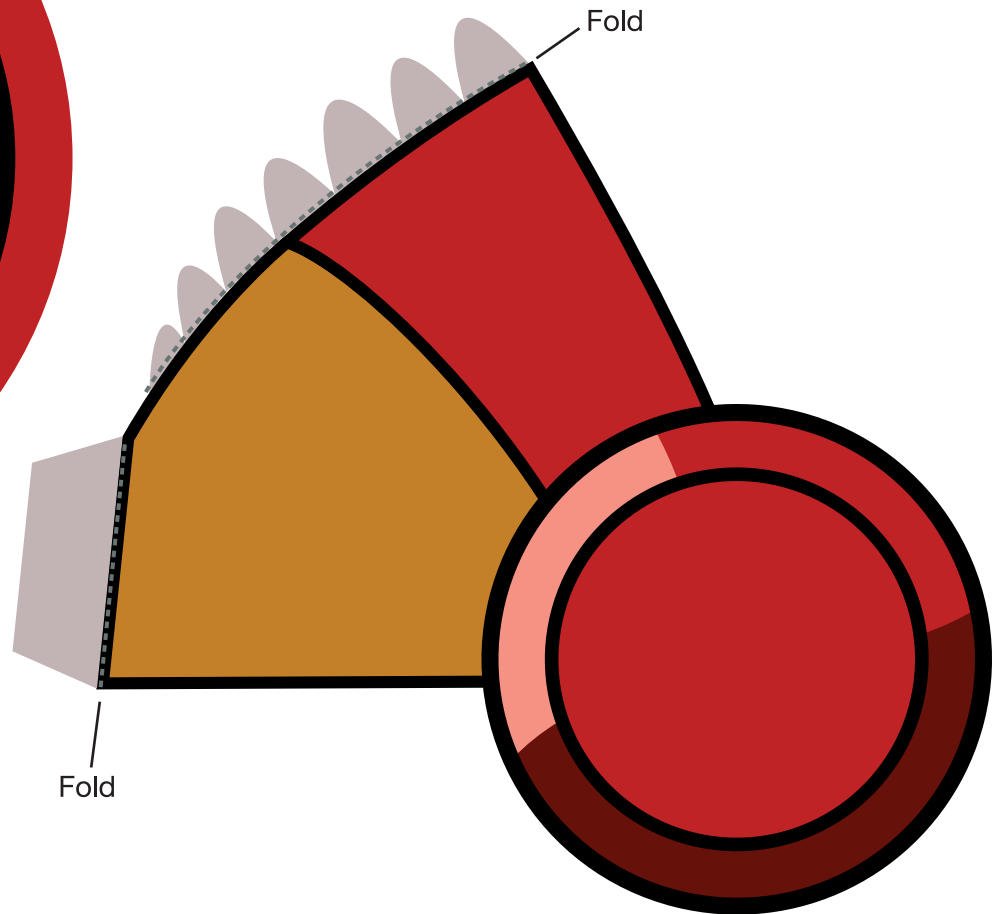


Iron Man Mask

Chest piece

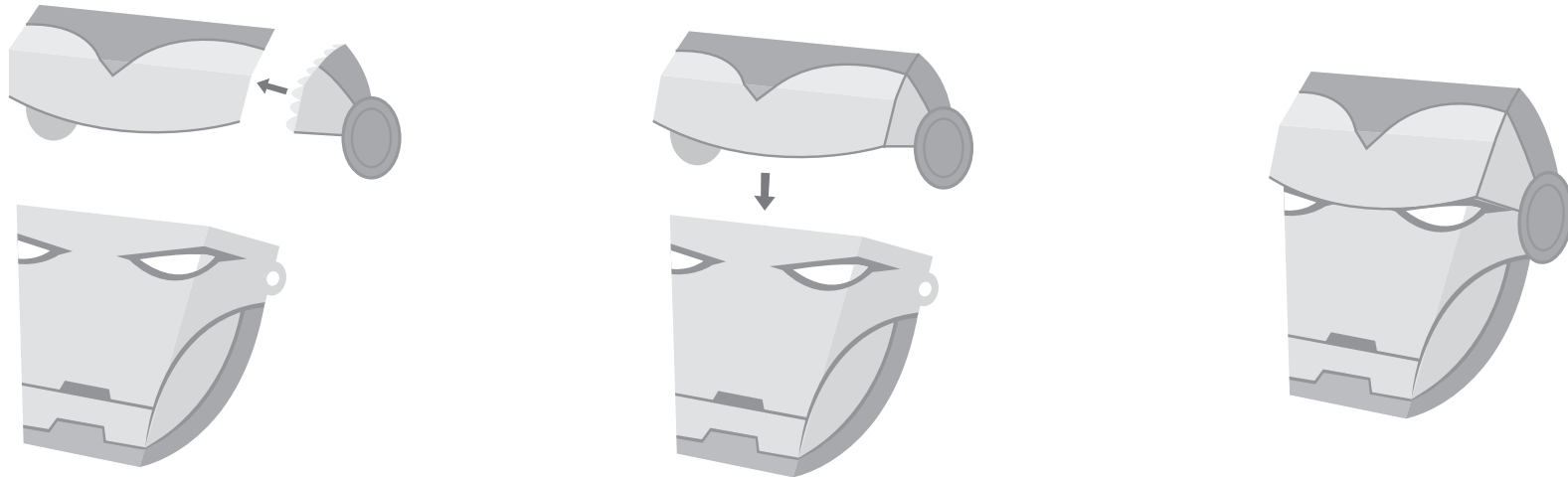


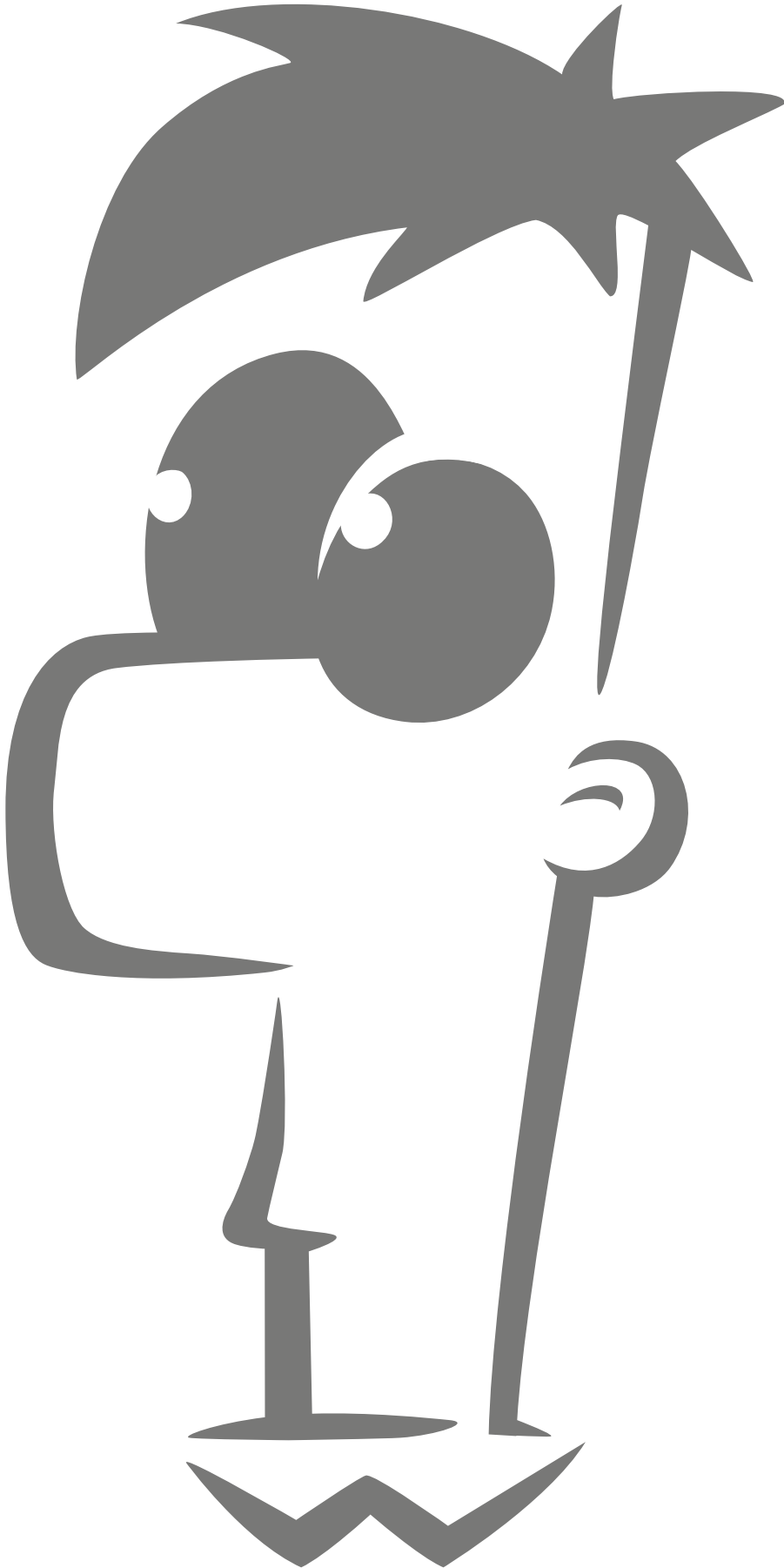
Left side of helmet



Iron Man Mask: Instructions

- 1) Print out the template on regular paper or cardstock and cut out the pieces.
- 2) Cut out the eye holes on the front of the mask, and make folds along all dotted lines. Using glue or double-sided tape, secure each tab to its corresponding piece. Punch holes on the sides of the mask where indicated.
- 3) Secure tabs on the right side of the helmet to their corresponding pieces.
- 4) Secure tabs on the left side of the helmet to the right side of the helmet to make the piece symmetrical.
- 5) Align the top of the helmet with the shaded area on the face mask, and secure with glue or double-sided tape.
- 6) Tie a string to each hole in the mask, and tie at the back of your child's head to secure Iron Man's helmet.
- 7) Using double-sided tape or a pin, secure the chest piece to your child's clothing.





Ferb Pumpkin Carving Template

Instructions:

1. There are two ways to transfer your design onto the pumpkin. One is to copy it freehand onto a clean, dry pumpkin with a water-based marker (mistakes can be easily corrected with a paper towel). The other is to tape your template to the pumpkin, then score the design into the skin by poking holes through the template with a nail or plastic poking tool (available in some pumpkin-carving kits).
2. Carve by starting at the center of your design and working outward (this avoids putting pressure on areas already carved). Begin with the innermost and smallest details. As each shape loosens up, gently push it out of the pumpkin with a finger or a dull pencil point (a good job for young kids).

Tip: If you cut something you didn't intend to, perform an ad hoc pumpkin surgery: Stick a toothpick through the flesh side of the piece and fit it back into place.

3. Lastly, put your jack-o'-lantern in a place of honor (away from flammables), and remember to blow out all candles before you go to sleep.

Icky Mickey and Minnie Halloween Charms



Icky Mickey and Minnie Halloween Charms

You'll need:

White or clear shrink paper for Inkjet printers (you can purchase this at art/craft supply stores or online)

Printed charms

Scissors

Hole punch

Jewelry accessories

Instructions:

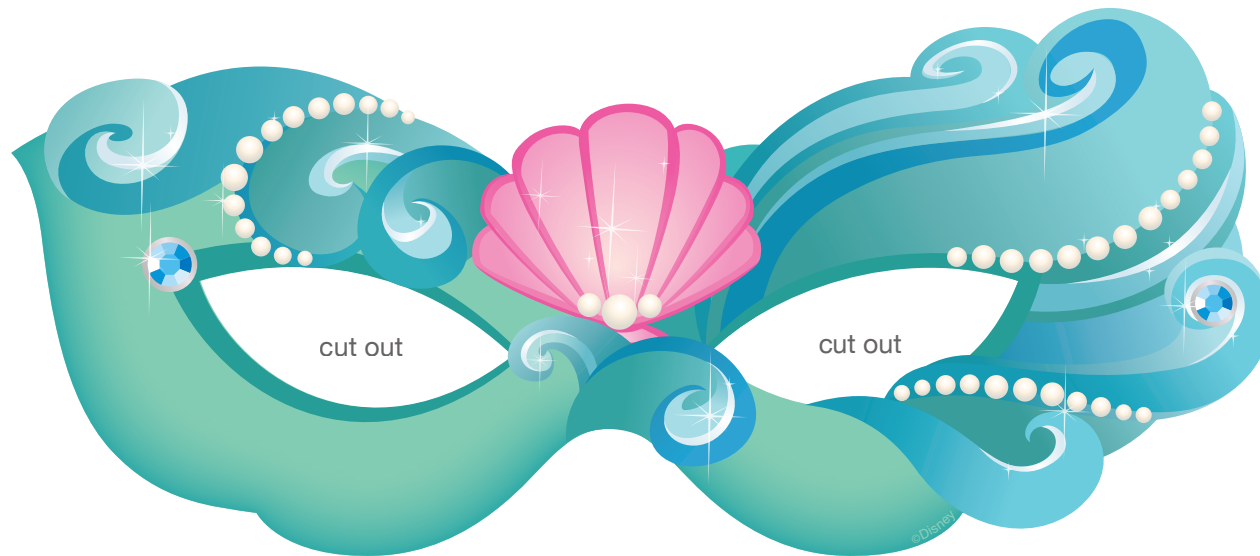
1. Print the charms on shrink paper and cut them out.
2. To use your charm as a bracelet or necklace pendant, you need to punch the holes before you bake them. If you wish to use the charm for a barrette, simply cut off the hole before you bake them.
3. Follow the baking instructions on the shrink paper package to bake the charms in a toaster oven or conventional oven. Watch the shrink plastic dance and curl! Do not allow children to use the oven.
4. If the charm is still slightly curled when it is finished baking, use a piece of cardboard or a spatula to flatten it completely.
5. Apply a couple coats of clear nail polish to seal the ink on the charm and make it water-resistant. Let the nail polish dry.
6. Add the charms to whatever you'd like! You can use jump rings and jewelry chain to create a charm bracelet or necklace, or attach them to a cell phone charm strap or zipper pulls. You can also glue charms to barrettes and hair pins.

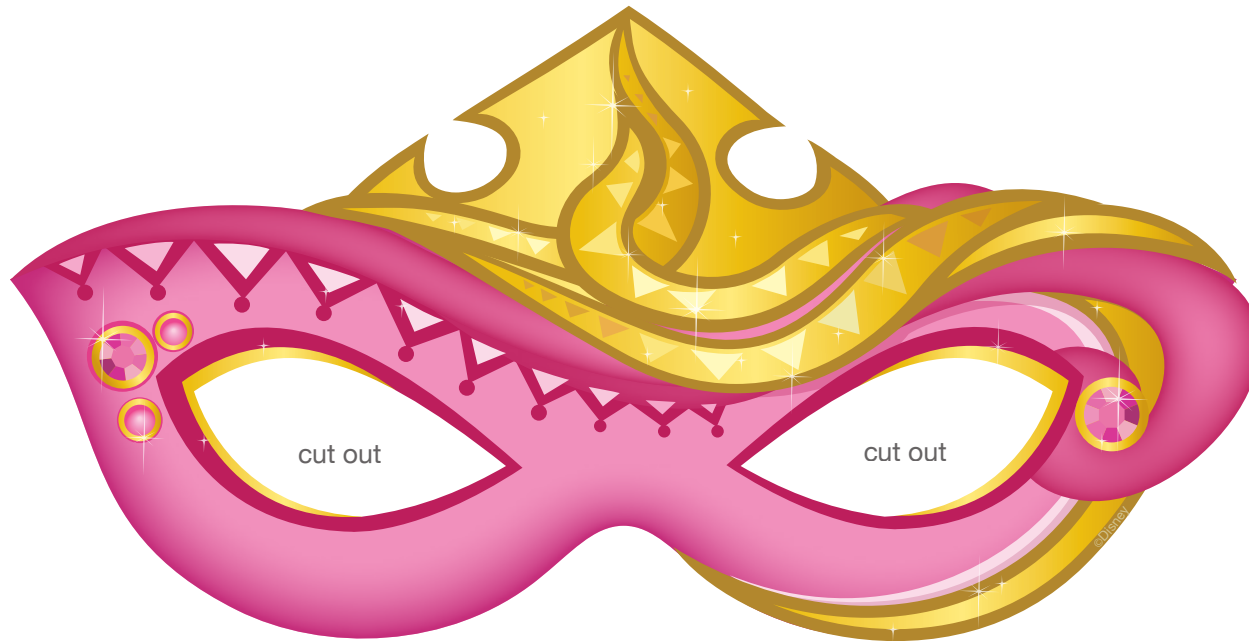

Make sure the pages are lined up before the glue dries. After the glue has dried, cut the white border off the calendar.
