SPOT[®] the Sun Smart Animals: Zoo Scavenger Hunt

Many animals have unique ways to protect their skin from the sun's harmful ultraviolet rays. As you walk around the zoo, can you identify these animals based on the pictures and the hints provided about how they are sun smart?

 A	These animals have black skin around their eyes to absorb the sun's rays, protecting their eyes from sun damage.	 D	This animal lives in hot areas where the sun is very hot. It has a hump on its back that stores fat and water, which it uses to survive in the hot sun.
 B	This animal spends most of its life underground, where it is protected from the sun's rays.	 E	This animal has a hard shell that protects its body from the sun's rays.
 C	This animal has a dark tongue that protects it from getting sunburned as it reaches out to catch its prey.	 F	This animal's feathers protect its skin from the sun's rays.

BEFORE YOU HEAD TO THE ZOO, MAKE SURE YOUR FAMILY ARE USING SUN SMART TOOLS.

Wear protective clothing when possible. This includes long sleeves, pants, a wide-brimmed hat and sunglasses.

Apply a broad spectrum, SPF 30 or higher sunscreen to all exposed skin before you head out. Remember to reapply every 2 hours while at the zoo.

When you need a break, find a shaded area to rest. Use this time to see which animals you still need to identify for this scavenger hunt.

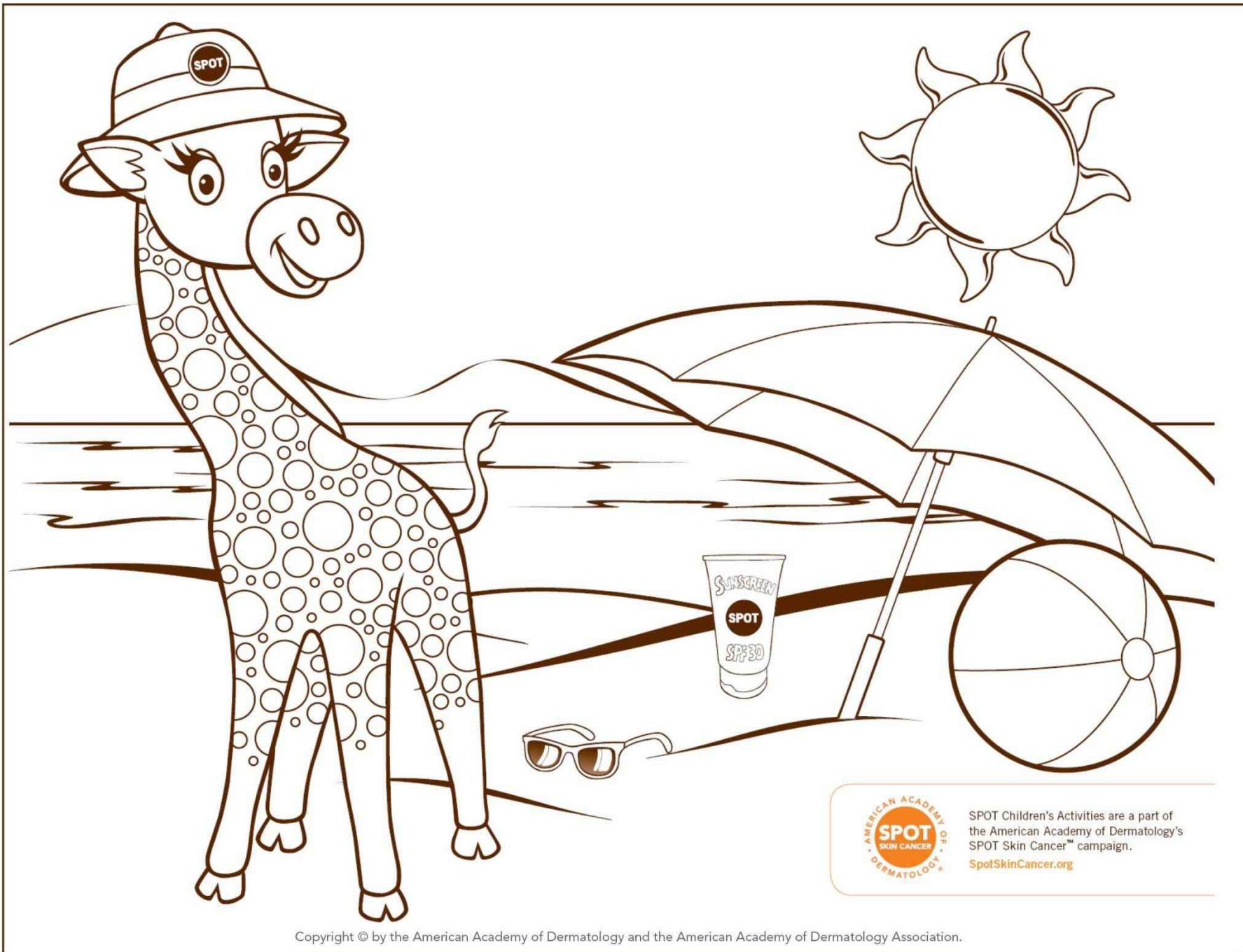
