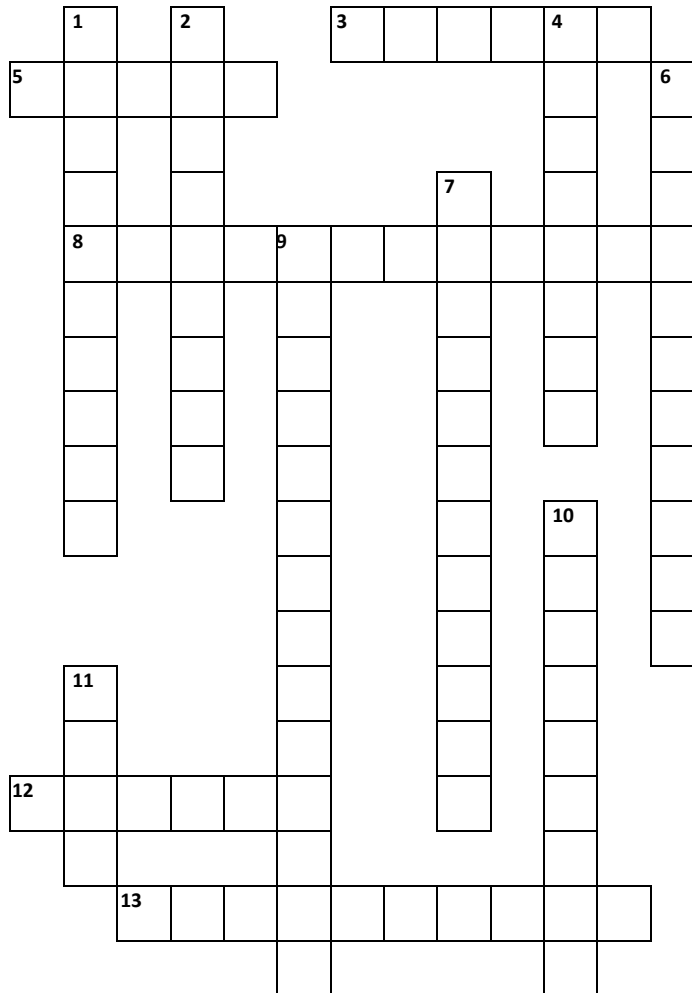

- 13** Before an earthquake, learn about what happens and how to be prepared if one occurs.

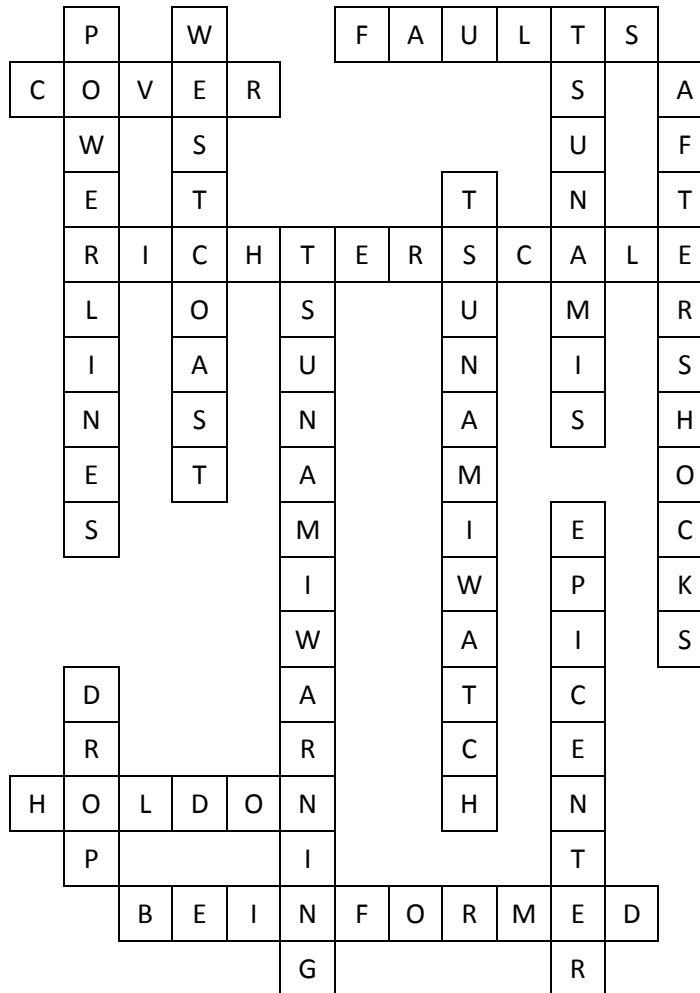
DOWN

- 7** Notice given when a tsunami had not yet been verified, but could exist and may be as little as an hour away.
- 9** Notice given when a tsunami may be close to your area. Usually includes predicted arrival times and expected arrival areas.
- 10** The area closest to where the earthquake occurs.

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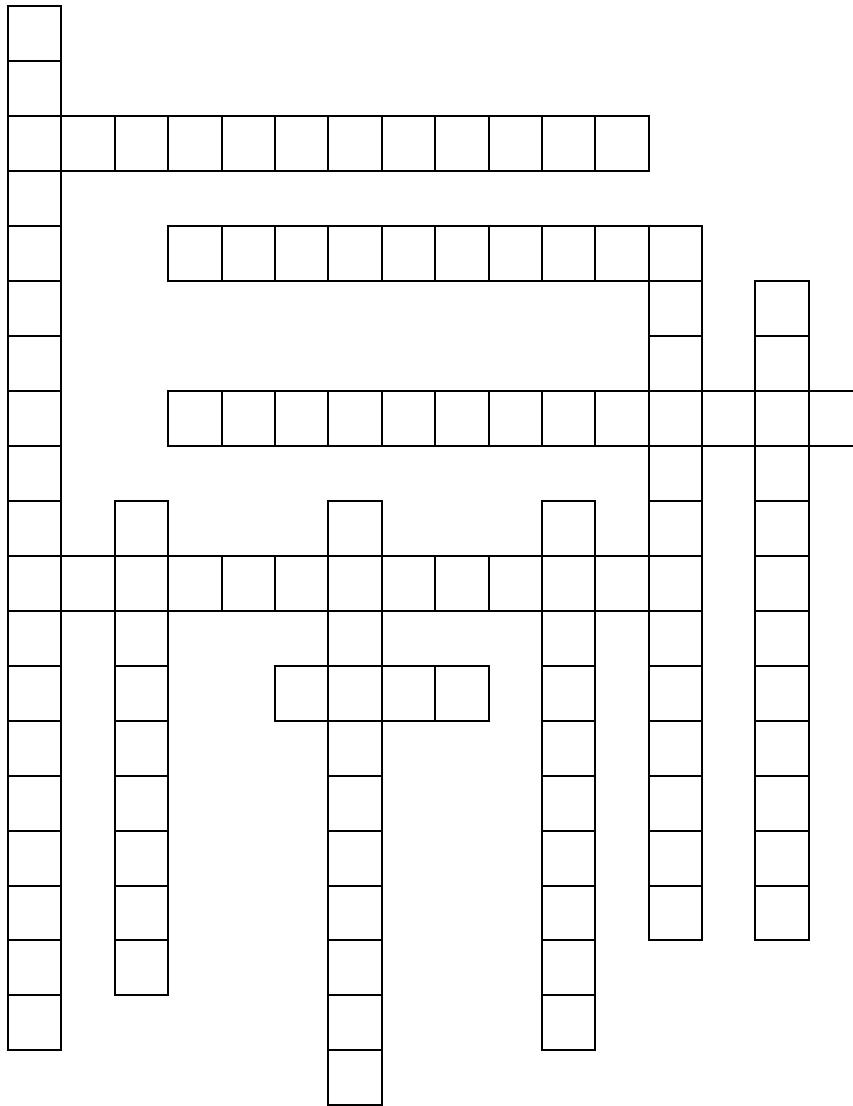

- 2 A loud indicator of possible flooding.

- 11 Do this in a pool, not in flood waters.

DOWN

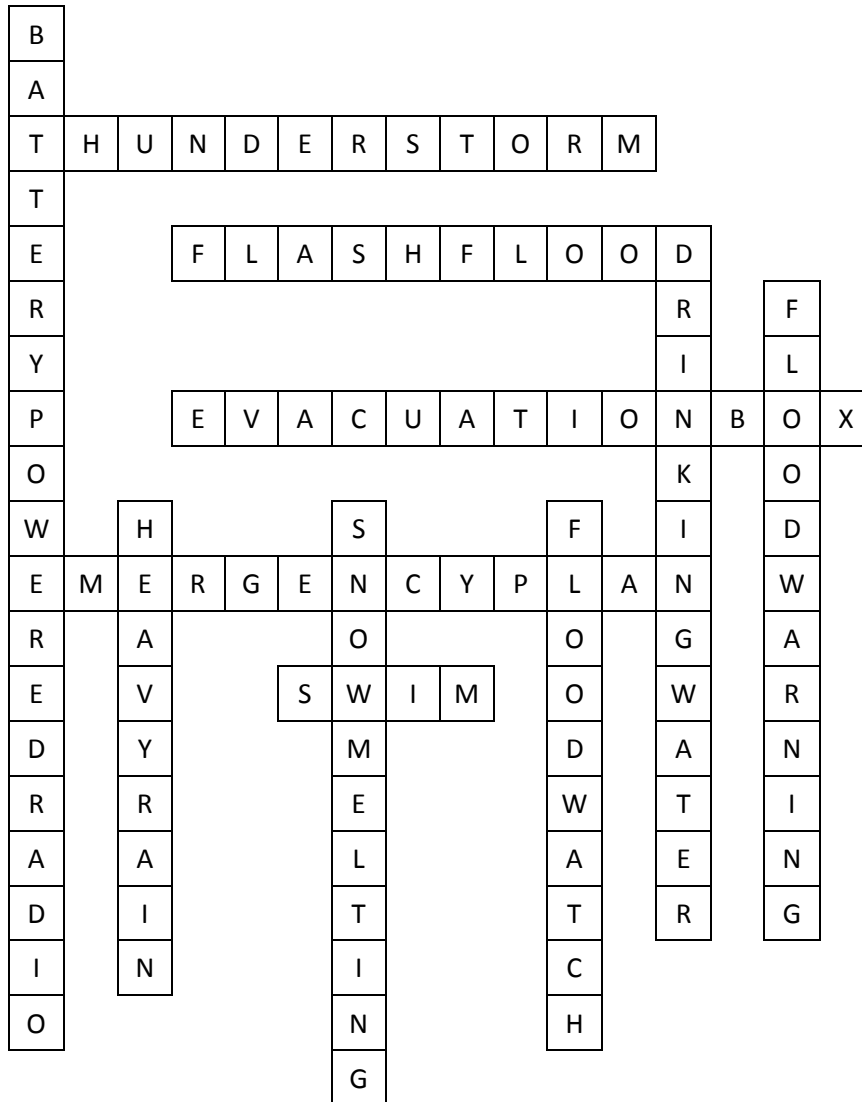
- 1 Listen to this for news and directions when the power goes out.

- 5 Issued to alert you when flooding is about to happen or had already occurred.
- 7 Can be a cause of flooding.
- 8 Can be a cause of flooding when a cold areas, such as mountains, warm up quickly.
- 9 Issued to alert you that conditions are favorable for flooding.

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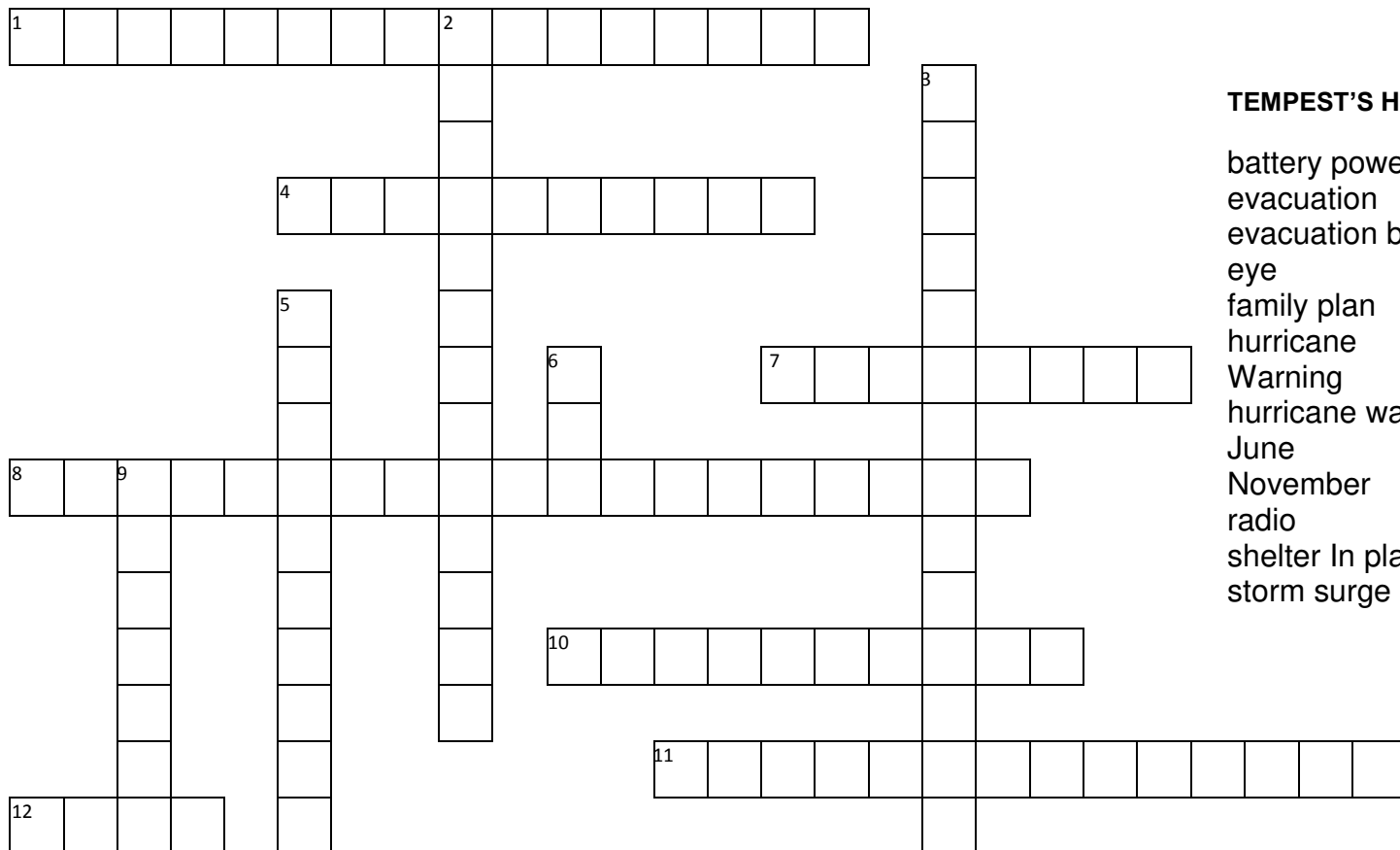

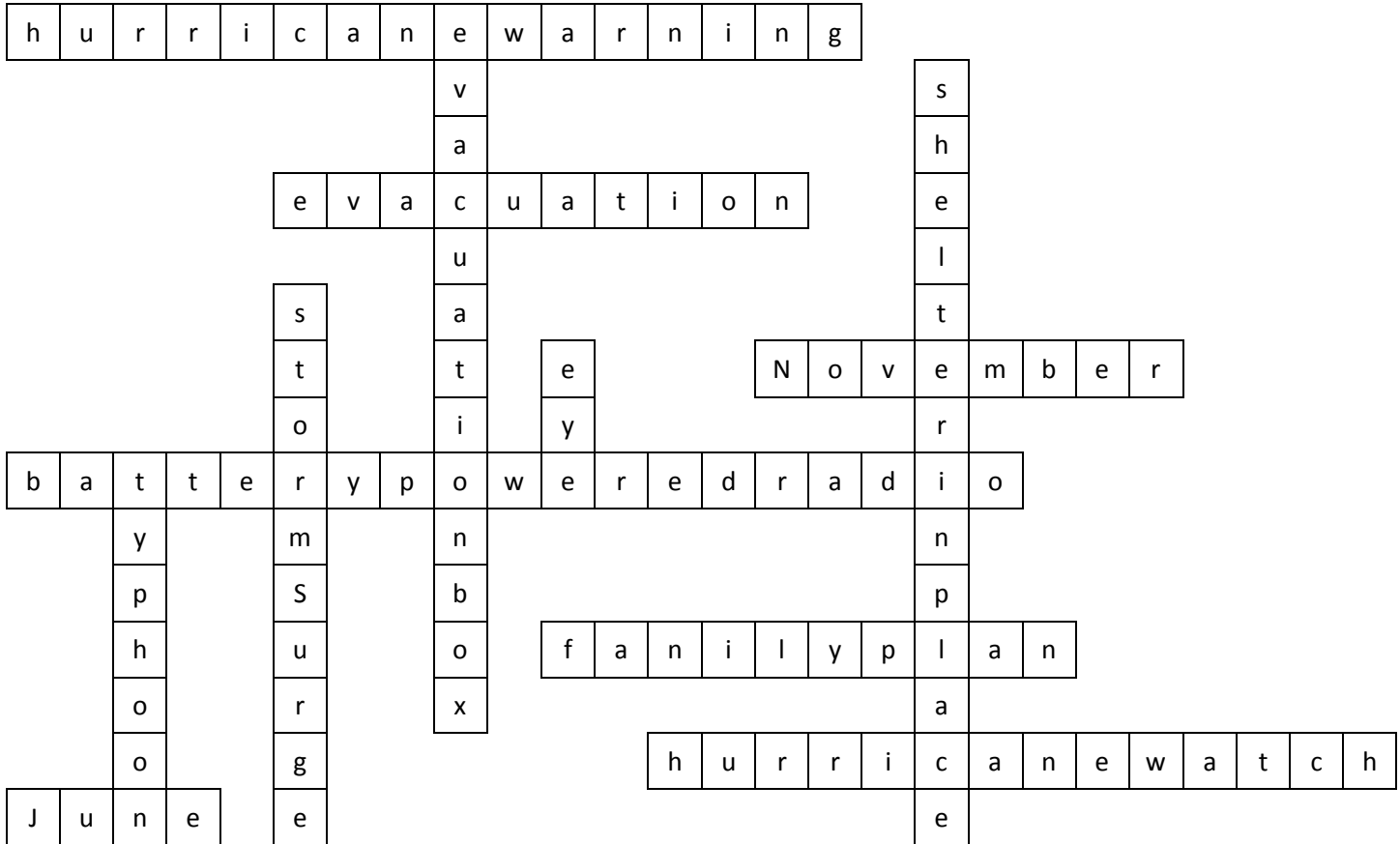

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Tempest's Tantalizing Crossword



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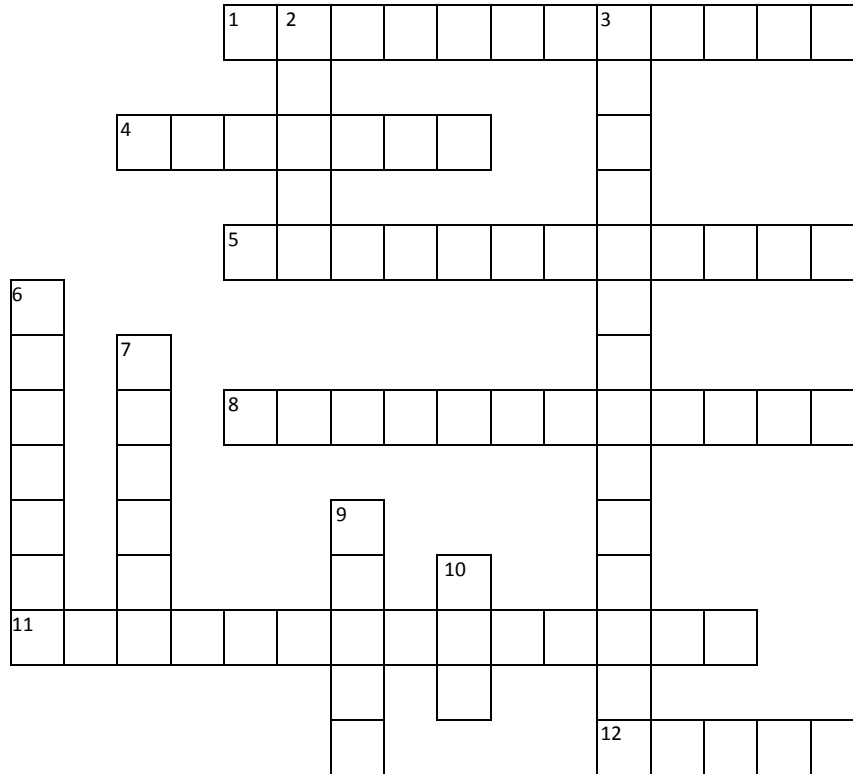

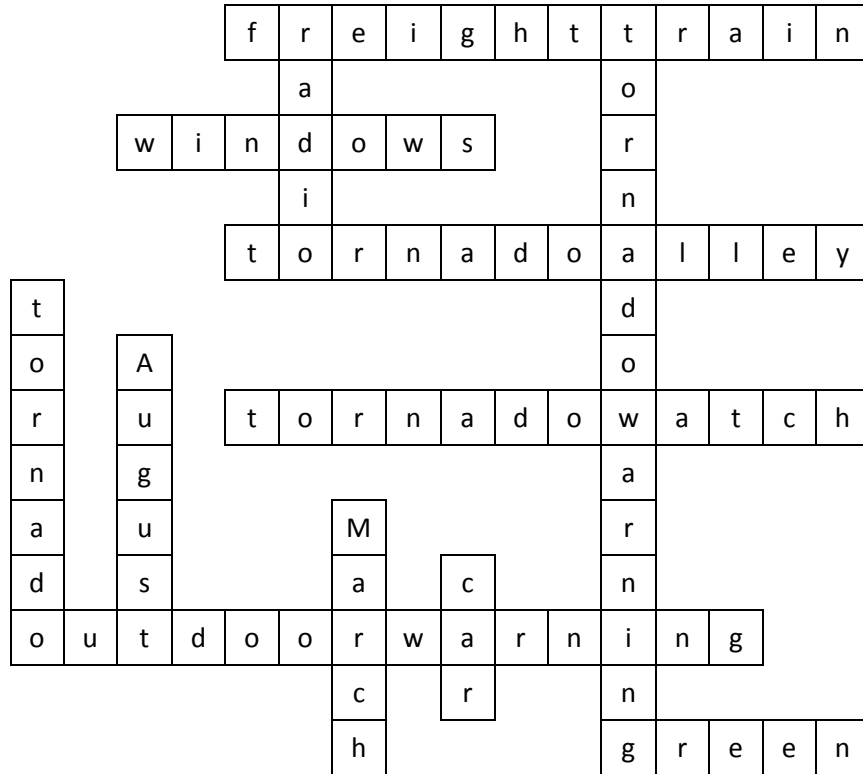
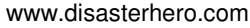
