Roads are dangerous. You should be with a grown-up like mum or dad or someone else you know. Always hold hands, or hold onto the buggy or shopping bag.






You can see lots of different vehicles using the road. This is called traffic. Use the word bank to name each vehicle.








Make your own Skooter mask



Instructions:


- Colour this picture of Skooter.

- Wear the mask to tell your friends what Skooter says Stop, Look, Listen!






Skooter has 3 special words but they are all mixed up. Can you work out what each word is and write it under the correct picture?













Howfouse a Zebra Crossing

- Zebra crossings have black and white stripes, just like a zebra.
- **STOP** at the crossing, behind the kerb.
- **LOOK** and **LISTEN** for traffic. Traffic should stop if drivers see you waiting to cross.
- WAIT on the pavement until all the traffic has stopped.
- When it is safe to do so, walk straight across the crossing.
- Make sure you keep LOOKING and LISTENING for traffic as you cross.





Howfousea Pelican Crossing


- **STOP** at the crossing.

- Then walk straight across the road, **LOOKING** and **LISTENING** as you cross.














