## Around the World in 1400



So many things were happening during this period of history known as the Renaissance. People were:

#### **EXPLORING** and **INVENTING** and **DRAWING!**

**EXPLORING:** New countries were being formed and new maps were being made. All around the globe the world was changing. In 1438 a new empire was formed by the Incas in <u>Peru</u>, while in <u>Istanbul</u> in 1453 an old empire, the Byzantine Empire, was coming to its end. During the year of 1483 explorers from <u>Portugal</u> mapped out the <u>Congo River</u> in the Kingdom of Kongo and in 1498 the explorer Vasco da Gama, also from Portugal, traveled east to the country of <u>India</u>. In 1492 Christopher Columbus set out from <u>Spain</u>, sailing west in hope of discovering the New World.

**INVENTING:** The Renaissance was a period when many inventions were made. It was during this time (1483) that Leonardo da Vinci designed his plans for a helicopter. In <u>Germany</u> (1455) the Gutenburg Bible was the first book ever printed with movable metal type. Also in Germany geographer Martin Benhaim made the first terrestrial globe. And in 1498 in <u>China</u>, a Chinese dentist invented the toothbrush.

**DRAWING:** Two of the most famous artists during the Renaissance were Leonardo da Vinci and Michelangelo. Both of these artists lived in <u>Italy</u>. Michelangelo sculpted from marble many statues for St. Peter's Church in <u>Rome</u>. Leonardo painted the Mona Lisa which can be seen in a museum in Paris, <u>France</u>.
